#### **MICHIGAN SERVICE CHALLENGE**

Most of us have noticed one very important aspect of grass roots Lions. Regardless of the task, the difficulty, the effort, the you name it... Our Lions love and emerge to meet a challenge. Over the years so many of us

have witnessed this blessing. We also witnessed the results of the spirit of Michigan when they are challenged. We can and do move mountains.

Take the recent challenge put out to the Michigan Lions by clubs supporting the huge increase in campers at Lions Bear Lake Camp. When the need arose there were Lions eager to meet that need. Blind, hearing impaired and juvenile diabetic campers were the direct recipient. The real difference was, instead of backing off on helping kids, the Camp and it's supporters chose to make a go of it. Consequences could have caused difficulties, but the Camp and the faithful Lions that back it knew what has to be done. They are doing it as you read this. With any luck they will achieve their goal and not incur any long or short term debt by investing in people. This is just one recent example of how grass roots Lions work to make a difference. In Bear Lakes' case there is a way to go yet, but we can be confident that Lions will come through.

Here is a simpler challenge, but one of major importance. Call it the Michigan Service Challenge. What is the Michigan Service Challenge? Very simple it is 1 reported service activity for each club in the state. How tough of a service project? Doesn't matter! How many service projects? At least one. Yup, that is correct – just one will do. (More would be great, but we have to start somewhere and that is with the number ONE!) While you are doing this service project(s) make it a habit to invite someone you know and respect for their grass roots attitude and desire to meet a challenge. How is that done? See them in the street, text them, phone them, whatever and say, "You've always liked to make a difference in our community. How would you like to ...." If they cannot that is fine. Still meet the service challenge. Why? Because you are a Lion and that is what we do. We make a difference.

Then what? Report it online. Don't know how. Ask for help from the District Governor, the Global Service chair or your district administrator. The big thing is to get it reported. Why? It shows other Lions that WE get the job done. It gives confidence. We make a difference. We care. It shows the whole world that as well. Our motto is "We Serve". Who do we serve? We serve PEOPLE. We are the gold standard of service. Time to let others know. When they see it, they just might develop the confidence to be a Lion too!




